A Message from Miss Cooke

As a community we are sending our positive energy, support and well-wishes to our students in years 3 and 5 as they complete their NAPLAN testing during this week and next week.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a series of assessments that students complete over a two-week period that allow us as a site, and outside educational authorities, to determine how students are travelling towards meeting important educational outcomes.

This is the first year that all students will be completing the test online, with our year 3 students still completing their Writing assessment using pencil and paper. The benefits of the online assessment is that it will result in more precise information about student skills and is more engaging for our learners. Students will be assessed on the types of skills that are essential to progress through school and life. The tests cover skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy.

Many of our students can proudly say they have completed their, 'Writing', 'Reading' and 'Conventions of Language' assessments with a positive and determined attitude. Over the next week students will be completing their, 'Numeracy' assessment and catching up on any missed tests for those who were away.

For our NAPLAN students, remember;

Try hard, stay focused and do your best. We are proud of you and we are here to support you!

If you see me around please say hi and if there are any programs or events you wish to see within the Community Hub, please let me know.


