It is a well-regarded, highly-structured 16 lesson role-play and play-based program to explore the benefits of developing social skills and friendship.

Over 16 lessons or more, students will work in a small group, led by one of our amazing SSOs, and be immersed in a variety of 'getting along' skills, stimulated by the experiences of a much-loved character, Archie. In each lesson the children will have the chance to help Archie solve the very same social difficulties that happen in their lives

As they do this, through activity, discussion, role-play and quizzes, they'll learn how to become a better friend and a more flexible social thinker. 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A Message from Miss Cooke

The staff and students at Karrendi are not skipping a beat as our site powers on, full steam ahead, towards our goal of developing student skills in reading. Due to the work and professional development that our staff engaged in during Term 1, we are seeing evidence-based reading practice occurring in every classroom, every day, which in turn sees our students actively immersed in effective reading development on a daily basis.

Our morning Heggerty program, that focuses on phonological and phonemic awareness, is being implemented site-wide and we are seeing positive growth in our students reading and phonemic awareness data. The InitiaLit program, that focuses on providing all students with the essential core knowledge for becoming successful readers, is being delivered in each of our Junior Primary classes and we are seeing great growth in our students enthusiasm and work with phonics and vocabulary development. Our Middle and Upper Primary classes are continuing to engage in explicit reading instruction, which is informed by data, that ensures our students are accessing the skills, knowledge and practice specific to their needs to ensure a comprehensive reading education.

Our Term 2 direction for improving student skills in reading will see us continue to implement the above programs with greater intensity and accuracy so that our students can fully benefit from the approaches. To continue to develop the skills of our staff we will be accessing a range of resources to ensure that our students have access to the most relevant and effective learning opportunities. These professional development resources will include utilising the skills and knowledge of our on-site staff to share their knowledge and expertise in reading development. We will also be accessing the support of the Literacy Guarantee Unit: Literacy Coach who has expertise in phonics and phonics instruction to upskill our staff in responding to student data in an evidence-based way.

We have a very full Term 2 ahead of us and we look forward to what it brings!

In Room 7 we have been working hard during Literacy Rotations to achieve our goals. Students have been placed into groups based on their needs, to help support their development in specific areas.


Karrendi Butterfly Garden Sign Competition

National Sorry Day is a day to acknowledge the strength of Stolen Generations Survivors and reflect on how we can all play a part in the healing process for our people and Nation. Every year on May 26th, National Sorry Day remembers and acknowledges the mistreatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who were forcibly removed from their families and communities, which we now know as, "The Stolen Generations." Whilst this date carries great significance for the Stolen Generations and other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, it is also commemorated by Australians right around the country.

Today our students listened to the story, "Sorry Day" by Coral Vass and Dub Leffler. The children participated in an activity using their ideas to colour a hand or an Aboriginal Flag and write words to describe the meaning of Sorry Day. The activity provided an opportunity for our students to reflect on how we can contribute to the healing process for our Nation together.































State German Competition Winners

In recent years, this evolved to students buying presents and visiting *Helping Hand Nursing Home* to give their gifts to the residents; joining them for a morning tea and engaging in enriching conversations. This has historically been a heart-warming and powerful experience for all involved.

To understand how special this has been to our students, here are some quotes from 2019 by students who shared their thoughts on the experience:

"We went shopping to find presents for people at Helping Hand. We used money from the cans and bottles we collected at school. We bought textas, paints, books, pens, pencils, games for them because it's nice for them to get presents at Christmas time. It made me feel good to help other people and respect others in need."

"We had a successful shopping spree. We bought lots of things for people at Helping Hand for Christmas. We bought dolls, bowling sets, puzzles and arts and crafts materials. It felt nice to do something for someone else and to know that it will make them happy."

"I enjoyed buying presents for people because they may not have visitors at Christmas. It made me feel happy that they will have a present at Christmas time."

"We all very much enjoyed going and buying Christmas presents for the elderly. It was good to go shopping during school hours and help the elderly by buying them dolls and paint brushes."

"Going shopping with the teachers outside of school was a really good experience. We all chose our gifts very wisely. We made sure the gifts were perfect for those at Helping Hand."

"Buying the gifts for the elderly home and spending the money was very fun and exciting. We got them many gifts like chocolate, stationary, and much, much more. Overall, it was great fun buying them gifts and we had a great time."
