### A Message from Miss Cooke

School holidays are a great time for our young people to rest, relax, spend time with the family and celebrate the good things in life. After a busy 2022, our students have certainly earned their break but, that doesn't mean the learning has to stop. Holi days give families the chance to create learning opportunities out in the real world and to keep that love of learning strong and thriving. Below are some school holiday activities that can keep our young people curious, learning and building their fundamental skills and knowledge through the holiday break.

- Making reading a part of your holiday routine will give your child the opportunity to maintain and extend the learning they did throughout the year.
- Read to your child each day or have them read an interesting book to you.
- Teach your child to read timetables, movie reviews, recipes.
- Set aside 10 minutes a day for your child to sit and read a text of their choosing (magazine, story book, newsletter, game cards).
- Practice sight words through game play memory, fish, snap.
- Take a visit to your local library.
- Visit the Zoo, a wildlife park or a museum and have your child read and reflect on the information plaques.
- Keep a holiday journal. Have them write about a movie they saw, an activity they did or even something that made them laugh.
- Play board games such as Scrabble, Scategories, Up Words
- Follow a recipe and teach them how to cook.
- Talk with them. Talk to them about world events. Ask them what they think and what their opinions are. Play 'I spy' or 'Guess who'. Keep them talking and keep them thinking.

The opportunities to take learning out of the classroom and bring it into the real-world are endless. Have some fun with it!

### **Classroom Correspondence**

Room 23 have been super busy delving deeper into what letters make certain sounds, we have done lots of practice with diagraphs and understanding that a diagraph is made up of two letters that make one sound eg. th, sh. We have begun learning what a trigraph is and understanding that a trigraph is made up of 3 letters that make one sound eg. igh. Students have grasped this new skill very quickly and are always asking to write challenging words with a trigraph to show off their understanding.



### Specialist Team Talk – EALD

The EALD students in Room 19 have been engaged in learning about language techniques used in different Australian poems. One of these linguistic techniques is using imagery to help create mental images in the reader's head. Students explored their own senses by evoking their touch, hearing, smell and sight while describing the big old gum tree near the oval. They also ta lked about their feelings when they were near the tree. The students were able to produce a wide range of different descriptive words, which will be used to create a poem as a group.

These reports help you to understand how your child is progressing and how we are supporting your child's development. Our teachers assess student learning using the Australian Curriculum. Each learning area within the Australian Curriculum has Achievement Standards. You will notice that our reporting template has been revised to ensure that parent/caregivers can see which parts of the Achievement Standards your child has met. We encourage you to read through your child's report and get in touch with us if you would like to ask any questions or are unsure about the information contained within the report.

### **Community Hub**

I can't believe we are almost at the end of the year and that I've almost finished up my third term with you all! It has gone so quickly and I have enjoyed every second! I am so excited to say that I am returning next year and I cannot wait to continue to grow our Hub and spend time with you all!

### **#Dance for Diversity**

This week students in Rooms 17, 21, 22, 23 and 24 came together to take part in a Pilot Study lesson called #Dance for Diversity. The intention behind this lesson was to build awareness and skills of inclusion through playful dance and movement activities in a 20-minute lesson targeted at students in Reception to Year 3. The pilot study itself has been developed with a federal grant from the Department of Social Services and is supported through research in inclusion and diversity content.

Students explored the meaning of the word 'Diversity' and went on a journey with Dash, the Wonderchum character, to explore how people of different cultures, different genders and different life challenges could all connect through dance.
