

NAIDOC Week 3rd-11th July

NAIDOC Week is an opportunity for all Australians to celebrate, learn and recognize the history, cultures and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. It is an opportunity for all Australians to learn about First Nations cultures and histories and participate in celebrations of the oldest, continuous living cultures here today.

This week, our students listened to Scared Stories and learnt about cultural traditions. Students participated in dot painting on boomerangs and snakes and learnt what NAIDOC Week means, followed by a performance from Dion Drummond. Dion Drummond's Aboriginal name is "Moogera", meaning storm. He is of Torres Strait Islander descent. Dion is one of Australia's most experienced First Nations performers, covering both mainland and Islander cultures as a dancer, singer and storyteller. Ask your child to show you some dance moves they learnt from his performance. Lantana Kindergarten also joined us at Dion's performance, and they also worked with Room 19 on an Indigenous art activity.
