A Message from Mrs Przibilla

How wonderful it was this year to start 2023 with all students able to attend classes after the staggered start we had last year in response to COVID. As we now return to a new 'normal' with very few restrictions, students are again able to access all the social, emotional and educational opportunities that attending school regularly provides.

When students are regularly late to school, they miss daily instructions and routines and can become self-conscious entering the classroom. It can also be disruptive for the class. A child that is 10 minutes late every day will miss 30 hours of instruction over the year and missing just 1 day of school a fortnight adds up to missing 1 year of school, by the time a child reaches year 10.

Research shows that daily school attendance is important for children to succeed in education and to ensure they don't fall behind both socially and developmentally. It is important that children develop habits of regular attendance at an early age. You can help your child to be ready and on time for learning each day by

- Preparing for school the night before by making lunches and packing bags
- Having a regular bedtime
- Removing technology from the bedroom at night
- Modelling punctual behaviour for work and appointments
