Principal's Message

Whilst our efforts to build students' academic skills continue, as do our efforts towards building their social and emotional capabilities.

You may have heard your child(ren) share what, "Zone" they are in, or were in, during their day at school. At the start of each school year, all of our students engage in our *Soaring to Success* two week program. One component of this program is, "The Zones of Regulation." The Zones of Regulation develops awareness of feelings, energy and alertness levels whilst exploring a variety of tools and strategies for regulation, prosocial skills, self-care, and overall wellness. The Zones provides students with an easy way to think and talk about how they feel on the inside and sort these feelings into four coloured zones, all of which are expected in life. Once students understand their feelings and zones, they can learn to use tools/strategies to manage different zones. The simple, common language and visual structure of The Zones of Regulation helps make the complex skill of regulation more concrete for learners and those who support them.



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Try using the language of The Zones of Regulation at home to support your child in understanding their feelings and managing different zones. Does this look familiar? It's no wonder that when people think of maths, their first reaction is 'BORING'!




We're not saying students don't need to practice being quick and fluent in their maths or that learning about multiplication isn't important, because it is, but our goal at Karrendi is to engage our students in maths learning that is meaningful and effective. We want to develop numerate students who are brave enough to take learning risks, can problem solve and can think about their maths and decide on the validity of their answer. We want our students to have the skills and confidence to apply their maths learning to real-life situations and have some fun while learning it too.

To continue in our focus on developing healthy numeracy dispositions in our students, and influenced by the research of Jo Boaler, a professor of mathematics at Stanford University, our staff have been exploring the maths culture within their classroom, with a key focus on developing the following attitudes within the mathematics classroom:

1. Everyone can learn maths to the highest level
2. Mistakes are valuable
3. Questions are really important
4. Math is about creativity and making sense
5. Math is about connections and communicating
6. Value depth over speed
7. Math class is about learning, not performing

Right Bite Standards

We know that children and young people are more likely to achieve their learning potential when they have access to healthy food and drink options. The Right Bite standards have been revised to meet the Australian Dietary Guidelines and the new Wellbeing SA nutrition classifications for schools. The revised standards replace the previous Right Bite Manual, which was released in 2008.
