#### A Message from Miss Cooke

Supporting our students to develop effective goal setting skills is one thing that we can do to set them up for success for their future. By helping our students to grow their skills in setting SMART goals, we will be encouraging them to not only dream big but also refine their lifelong skills in persistence, developing a strong work ethic and working hard for the things that are important to them; all essential elements for successful futures.

SMART goals are goals that are:

**Specific:** what is one specific and small area for improvement?

Measurable: what is the criteria that lets our students know if they have or have not achieved their goal?

Attainable: with the knowledge and skills that they currently have, is this something they are ready and able to achieve?

**Relevant:** will achievement of this goal positively impact their learning and life?

**Time-bound:** what is the date that the student is aiming to achieve this by?

From Week 5 this term, each student will begin their first *Individual Student Goal Setting Cycle* for 2023. Students will be given a goal to work towards that is influenced by data, reflective of learning progression and meaningful to them as learners. Keep an eye out for a Goal Setting template that your child might be bringing home. You will see the goal they are working towards, the motivator or reward that they have chosen and the actions that they have decided to enact to help them achieve their goal over the next five weeks.

#### **Classroom Correspondence**

Room 23 students have been developing their oral language skills by playing Barrier Games. Barrier Games are played like the board game Battleship. Two people sit with a barrier (e.g. box, or book) in the space between them. Instructions are spoken for each person to follow. The aim of this idea is that when the barrier is removed both the two players will have the same result (e.g. same picture scene or Lego construction). This will be because the player has listened carefully and/or gave clear accurate instructions to the other player.

There are many benefits from using Barrier Games with a child such as developing: listening skills, oral language skills, social language skills, clear talking and understanding of concepts. They are great for extending the amount of information your child can understand or express within a sentence.

Students had a lot of fun playing these games, and we will continue to include them in our Literacy learning this year.

These games are also lots of fun to play at home! If you google 'barrier games' lots of ideas will pop up!







#### **Specialist Team Talk**

In Term 1, Junior Primary PE lessons are focused on developing the Fundamental Movement Skills (throwing, catching, kicking, etc). We are also practising skills needed for Sports Day, which will be held on Friday 14th April. Students have been improving their accuracy in throwing bean bags into hoops, as well as trying the Egg and Spoon Race, 3 Legged races, and the Baton Race.












#### Meet the Staff Member

#### **ORBIS Mathematics Training**

Throughout the year staff at Karrendi will be embarking on their own learning journey in Mathematics. We will be attending workshops that will support in designing Mathematics learning that engages children and expands their ability and confidence to apply their mathematical knowledge in their learning. Staff have attended the first session of the training and will be implementing new learning across all classrooms. We learned the importance of developing a positive, growth mindset surrounding mathematics and that we can all be mathematicians.

Here are some suggestions for activities you can do with your child at home to develop their mathematical thinking skills:

#### **Junior Primary:**

• Counting collections of objects around the home and grouping them in ways that are simple to count. For example, in groups of 2, 4, 5 or 10.

#### **Primary:**

• Select a target number and ask your child to write as many number sentences that has the target number as the answer. For example, Target number is 24 and some number sentences could be 20 + 4, 30-6 or 12 x 2.
