On Wednesday I was lucky enough to join our reception and year 1 students from room 21 for our first 'What's the Buzz?' session! In our first session we met Archie – a character we will be exploring each week through stories; seeing how Archie navigates a variety of social situations, including making friends, sharing, taking turns etc. and how he manages his emotions.

A Message from Miss Cooke

As teachers, it is our role to grow and develop the minds in our classrooms. Whether we are teaching a brand new Reception how to hold a pencil properly or working with a Year Six student to analyse digital media texts, supporting, guiding and working together to build the skills and knowledge of our students, is always at the forefront of our minds.

Did you know that at our site we have teachers who are fresh into the world of teaching and are now half-way through their first year in the profession? We also have teachers who have spent the last 43 years refining, improving and exploring their craft. We then have the range of experience that sits in between; teachers who have taught in big schools, teachers who have taught in similar small schools, teachers who have taught a collection of different year levels and had a collection of different roles. With all of that experience that surrounds our students, we can proudly say that improving, refining, reflecting-on and modifying practice to best support the needs of our students is always our number one priority.

Throughout terms one and two, our teachers engaged in rigorous, research-informed professional development as individuals, professional learning groups, external learning groups and as an entire teaching team. The result of this so far is that we are seeing increased consistency between classes which means that regardless of which class a student is in, all students are being guided by a teacher who is continually improving their practice. We are seeing learning programs that are designed specifically to support individual student needs, we are seeing learning environments that place learner development at the heart of what they do. We are seeing our classes trialing different approaches and methods of learning so that we can reflect and identify which is the most effective for our students. With an unwavering focus on reading and teacher development, we have seen a lot of growth in our site so far this year and it is a growth we will continue to see.

Specialist Team Talk

The Primary Schools Music Festival is a school based choral education program brought to you by the SA Public Primary Schools Music Society and the Department for Education. It is a program that uses music and singing as a way of linking and connecting the various subject areas within the Australian Curriculum along with providing students an alternative avenue for developing the knowledge, skills, behaviours and dispositions that will support them in their learning at school and in their lives outside of school.

For Karrendi, this is our seventh year involved in the Primary Schools Music Festival. For some of our staff and many of our student families, performing at the Festival of Music is a cherished primary school memory. Performing on stage with hundreds of other students in front of hundreds of supportive family and friends is a wonderful experience that we are lucky to provide our students with. This year students in rooms 5 and 7 have been working hard to learn a repertoire of thirteen songs that our year 5 and 6 students will be performing at the Festival Theatre as part of the Primary Schools Music Festival, in week 9 of this term. Our choir has and will continue to enlist the support of staff members, an accompanist, external choirs and key conductors from the Festival of Music to learn and prepare for their upcoming performance.

Now that we are only weeks away, we look forward to supporting our students through this experience and we hope that it gives them those memories that when they look back on their achievements, they can't help but smile. For families who are wanting to attend, tickets go on sale through Ticketek on Monday 8th August.



Camp Fun at Arbury Park!

Last term, in Week 10, the students in Years 4/5/6 went on camp to Arbury Park Outdoor School. This was a new experience for all of the students, which they thoroughly enjoyed. 
