A Message from the Principal

Pupil Free Day Information

We had a very productive day focusing on moderation and school improvement during our Pupil Free Day on Friday, 8th November. As part of our moderation learning, staff worked together in their Professional Learning Communities to analyse student work samples with the aim to consolidate agreements regarding grading.

During the afternoon, staff evaluated our work regarding school improvement in 2019. This involved working in Professional Learning Communities and recording information answering the following three questions in relation to our Site Improvement Plan goals.

- Which actions for improvement had the biggest impact on student learning? How do you know? What evidence do you have?
- Which actions for improvement had the least impact on student learning? How do you know? What evidence do you have?
- What actions in your teaching/professional development will be most beneficial to continue improving learning outcomes?

Information recorded by staff has helped us to develop our 2020 Site Learning Plan. Furthermore, to support us in this process, we engaged in professional development at our staff meeting in week 5 refreshing our understandings about success criteria. The main points taken from this learning were Success Criteria are:

- Directly connected to goals and targets
- Precisely focussed on what students will be able to do, say, make or write when teachers' actions for improvement are having the desired impact on their learning of the Australian Curriculum.
- Used to monitor progress towards targets in our Site Improvement Plan.

We look forward to sharing more about our school improvement journey in the near future.
