A Message from the Principal

External School Review

Last year our school was scheduled for an External School Review in Term 4. This Review was postponed due to unforeseen circumstances. The External review will now take place this term in week 4 on Tuesday 20th and Wednesday 21st February. The purpose of external school reviews is to support schools to raise achievement, sustain high performance and provide quality assurance to build public confidence in government schools. We will find out the aspects of our school's improvement that have been verified through the review processes as well as the improvements that we need to make in the future. In week 1 we sent home letters regarding the Review with a tear-off slip on the bottom. If you don't want your child to participate in conversations with the Review Panel, please complete the tear-off slip and return to school by next Monday, 12th February.

Information regarding gastro

Over the last few days we have had reports of gastro from classes, most predominately in the Early Years. We have taken the following steps in regard to this situation:

- All teachers have again reiterated with students hygiene in regard to washing hands with soap and patting hands dry with a paper towel after they have been to the toilet and before and after eating food
- Our pool is checked every morning to ensure correct chemical balances
- New reminder signs have been put up in all toilet areas.
- our cleaning company come to school today and did a deep extra disinfectant clean in all Early Years rooms. We have scheduled extra cleaning over the next week and will reassess if we need further additional cleaning services.

We would appreciate it if parents and caregivers also remind their children about effective hand hygiene to help with prevention.
