A Spotlight on Learning - Room 22

Over the last two weeks Room 22 have been learning about forces in Science. Students have been investigating different push and pull mechanisms which create different forces. During this learning students have begun to learn about diagrams in science and the importance of labelling. To label forces, students now know that they must correctly draw arrows into their diagrams to show whether the force is a push or pull.

To support their investigations, students created car launchers out of shoe boxes, rubber bands and paper clips with different starting points and investigated whether the force created by the rubber bands changed the distance at which their toy cars travelled. They worked in small groups to complete the investigation and enjoyed creating, experimenting and testing theories throughout the lesson.
