## A Message from Miss Schinella

As part of Department for Education policy, all Year 3-10 students are required to complete diagnostic assessments called Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT). The diagnostic assessments are conducted to measure student growth throughout the year. These assessments give valuable information to teaching staff about your child's current learning strengths and needs and enables teachers to better plan learning as they progress through the levels of schooling.

Karrendi students began PAT assessments this week. All students from Years 3-6 will complete a reading assessment and a math assessment by the end of this term. Year 1 and 2 students will complete a maths assessment early next term. The tests are conducted online and scheduled in learning time throughout the week as part of regular lessons.

I am extremely proud of how our students have displayed our school values of Love of Learning and Positive Mindset to complete their assessments so far.

A fair test requires us to make predictions, record a detailed method, only change one variable, record data accurately and to write a conclusion based on our results.

#### **Malpa Young Doctors**

Our Young Doctors followed the recipe by reading the ingredients and method to make their own Damper. It was messy and incredibly fun!
