

Uniform Policy

At Karrendi Primary School, we believe that uniform plays an important role in creating a sense of identity, belonging and safety for our students, whilst also promoting pride in who we are.

The design and concept of our school uniform was determined by the Uniform Committee and the Governing Council, supported by student and community consultation.

All students, families and staff members have a role to play in working collaboratively to encourage compliance with the school uniform. Enrolment at our school is on the understanding that Karrendi Primary School's Uniform Policy will be adhered to

School hats: Given the changing Australian climate and the UV Index reaching 3+ across the year, students must wear their hats each day during times of outdoor play and sport.

The following items can be purchased independently:

Pants: Pants are to be plain navy all over. This includes track pants or cotton fleece pants. Jeans are not permitted.

Shorts and skirts: Shorts, skirts and skorts are to be navy all over.

Dresses: Dresses are to be navy and white checked or red and white checked.

Undergarments: Undergarments are to be plain navy all over. This includes long sleeve tops, skivvys and stockings. Hoodies are not permitted.



Footwear: Footwear needs to be within health and safety guidelines- sports shoes, secure and sturdy school shoes/ sandals, where toes are enclosed, are to be worn. Thongs, high heels, ugg and football boots are not permitted.

Other requirements

Hair: Children must ensure that their hair does not create a health or safety risk. Children with hair that is shoulder length or longer are required to have their hair tied back. This also serves as a preventative measure in avoiding the spread of head lice.

Jewellery: Children who have their ears pierced are required to wear only sleepers or studs. Dangling earrings or hoops are not permitted.

Logos: No visible brand names, stripes or logos, except the official school logo are permitted on any clothing.
